Stevens, the first Bishop of the Missionary Jurisdiction of the South in the Reformed Episcopal Church, CMTS has been a critical institution in the life of the Diocese of the Southeast of the Reformed Episcopal Church and the metropolitan Charleston, SC, area.

Since its inception, Cummins has evolved to become an ecumenical training ground for people of all denominations, races, and backgrounds.

Course Offerings for Spring Semester 2025

Mondays
OT 731 Old Testament Book Study—Exodus
Dr. Echols, Professor

This course studies the book of Exodus to discover the structure, historical background, theme, relationship to the plan of redemption, the Bible as a whole, and practical application and meaning for today.

Tuesdays
BIB 500 Introduction to the Old Testament
Professor TBA

This course provides a fundamental overview of the Bible, covering its origins, original languages, and translation process. Students will examine the development of the biblical canon and the ideas of inspiration and inerrancy. The curriculum highlights the structure and themes of the Old Testament, focusing on what makes the Bible unique among religious texts. This course is designed for those looking for a comprehensive introduction to the Old Testament. This course is required for all students.

Thursdays
CH 503 The Apostolic Fathers
Dr. Panagiotou, Professor

This course examines writings of Christian theologians and leaders from the 1st and 2nd centuries AD. Students study their historical contexts, backgrounds, and texts, highlighting their intellectual and spiritual contributions and their importance to today's Christian Church. The focus is on Ignatius of Antioch, Clement of Rome, and Polycarp of Smyrna. Students explore the Didache, one of the earliest Christian manuals of church life after the New Testament. If time permits, the course may also cover the Epistle of Diognetus, the Epistle of Barnabas, and the Shepherd of Hermas. This course concentrates solely on orthodox Christian writers, excluding the Gnostic heretical texts circulating during that period.

All classes begin at 5:30 p.m. However, the professor could amend the time.

Degrees/Programs Offered

Master of Divinity (M.Div.)

This is a three-year program, 90 hours degree designed to prepare students for ordination and ministry in the local church.

Master of Arts in Christian Leadership

This is a two-year, 36-hour program designed to prepare students for leadership roles inside or outside the church.

Diploma in Theology

This four-year, 120 hours diploma is designed to provide a concentration in theological education for those without a college degree.
